Nepal is practicing a devolved system of government with 7 provinces and 753 local administrative units (known as Palikas). Palikas have both the funding and the authority to oversee local roads and manage transportation infrastructure within their jurisdictions.

Objective




To improve road safety applying an approach that enables communities to advocate for a change in local levels through community mobilisation.


